Rules And Show Regulations

1. MEMBERSHIP

- (a) A Member's ticket costs £3
- (b) Each ticket entitles the Member to both admission to the Show and to compete in as many classes as they wish.
- (c) Entries in the Children's Section are free of charge.

2. DEFINITION OF SECTIONS

All sections are open to any competitor unless stated otherwise.

3. ENTRY FORMS

Competitors are requested to complete the Entry Form **in the centre pages** of this schedule and to lodge it with the Secretary before the Show along with their Membership Card number so that the necessary staging may be arranged in good time.

4. VASES

Vases will be provided by the Society, FREE OF CHARGE.

5. STAGING

The Community Hall, East Linton, will be open for the staging of exhibits between 7.00pm and 9.00pm on the Friday evening before the Show and between 8.00am and 10.00am on the morning of the Show.

Competitors and their assistants must be clear of the hall by 10.00am on the day of the show.

6. JUDGING

Only Judges and Official Stewards will be allowed in the hall between 10.30am and 1.00pm while judging is in progress. The decision of the judges will be final, and where there are three or fewer entries in one class the judges, at their discretion, may withhold a prize.

7. EXHIBITS

- These must be of competitors' own growing and in their possession for at least six weeks prior to the Show.
- All vegetables must be clean, sound and properly dressed.
- Undue dressing may disqualify.

EXHIBITORS MAY NAME VARIETIES, WHERE KNOWN FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE PUBLIC.

8. COMPLAINTS AND PROTESTS

Must be lodged with the Secretary in writing before 3.00pm on the day of the Show, specifically stating the objection.

9. LOSSES or DAMAGE

The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to any exhibits before, during, or after the Show, but will take all reasonable care to prevent damage being sustained.

10. STAGING CARDS

The Treasurer on receipt of a completed Entry Form will issue staging cards. The exhibitor must mark class numbers on the back of the staging card. The Show Manager and Committee will direct the final placing of exhibits on the show tables.

11. PRIZE MONEY

Prizes will be presented at 3.00pm and prize money will be paid out between 3.30pm and 4.30pm on the day of the Show. Competitors **must complete and sign the official receipt form** issued to prize-winners and present it to the Treasurer before payment will be made.

12. SHOW BOARDS

Pansies, Begonias, and Fuchsias will be the only flowers shown on boards.

13. NOVICE SECTIONS

Open to anyone who has never won a prize e.g., 1st 2nd 3rd, or hasn't entered the show before.
